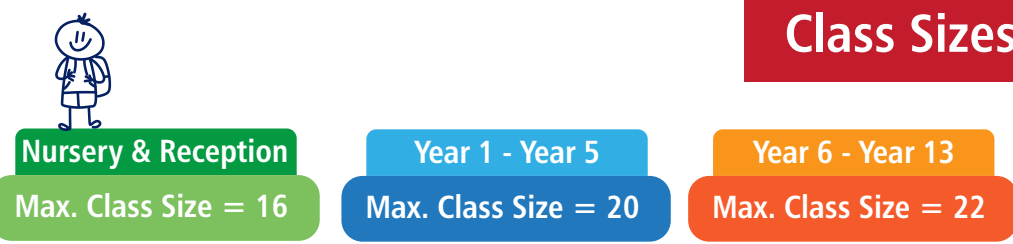

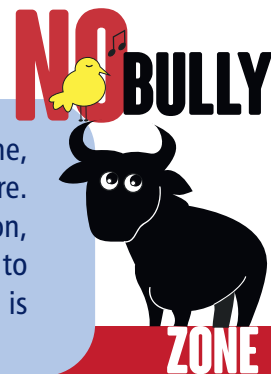
Our Four Houses
